Changes to the Zone 5 and Zone 6 Pools

> Why is Transco changing the Market Area Pool rules?

- Transco began charging fuel on forward haul and backhaul transactions in Zone 5 and Zone 6
 effective April 1, 2017. This was a result of the increase of supply in Zone 6, expansion
 projects, and system modifications that provide for gas to flow in both directions in Zones 5
 and 6.
- With this fuel change, Transco's original need to charge into the pool is no longer a concern.
 Therefore, to be consistent across all pools in the market area, this filing will change the Zone
 and Zone 6 pools to charge <u>OUT</u> of the pool instead of <u>INTO</u> the pool.
- With this transition of charging <u>OUT</u> of the pools, the MAP crediting will no longer be applicable.
- Transco is filing to make these the Zone 5 and Zone 6 pool changes effective October 1,
 2018.



Zone 5 and Zone 6 Charges and Crediting

- > Zonal commodity charges and fuel will be assessed on transportation OUT of the Zone 5 and Zone 6 Pools.
- Zonal commodity charges and fuel will not be assessed on transportation INTO the Zone 5 and Zone 6 Pools.
 - Charges will be assessed from receipt zone, therefore if the receipt is the same zone as the delivery pool, there would be no charge.
- Crediting mechanisms will not be utilized for Zone 5 and Zone 6 Pool transactions.
- Zone to Zone Imbalance page will be modified to remove the Pool and Non-Pool imbalance information used for crediting in the market area pools.

- > **Zone 4/OIA 2:** Priority of Service (POS) Filing (RP18-314), pending FERC approval
- > **Zone 5, 6:** Fuel is charged in both directions in Zone 5 and Zone 6 (effective April 1, 2017, RP17-452).
