### **Commission Approval of the Stipulation and Agreement Filed in Transco's General Section 4 Rate Case Proceeding (Docket No. RP12-993)**

On December 6, 2013 the Commission issued an order approving the August 27, 2013 Stipulation and Agreement without modification. Absent any requests for rehearing (none are expected), the Stipulation and Agreement will become effective March 1, 2014. Refunds of amounts collected in excess of the settlement rates for the period March 1, 2013 – February 28, 2014, including interest, will be made no later than April 30, 2014.

### **Mississippi Canyon Block 108 Application for Abandonment by Sale (Docket No. CP14-34)**

On December 27, 2013, Transco submitted a request pursuant to section 7(b) of the Natural Gas Act and the Commission regulations to abandon by sale to High Point Gas Gathering, LLC, Transco's 100% ownership interest in the Mississippi Canyon Block 108 Lateral, and to High Point Gas Transmission, LLC, Transco's 25.3% ownership interest in the Mississippi Canyon Block 194 Lateral located in offshore and onshore Louisiana.

### **Brandywine Creek Replacement Project (Docket No. CP12-497)**

On December 19, 2013, FERC issued an Order Denying Rehearing of the July 18, 2013 order in this proceeding. Transco argued in its request for rehearing that the costs of the Brandywine Creek replacement facilities should be rolled-in to Transco's system rates, rather than rolled-in with the costs of the Sentinel Expansion Project. On rehearing, the Commission concluded that the Brandywine Creek replacement facilities were designed to address a problem integrally related to the Sentinel Expansion Project, not to improve or maintain existing service. Therefore, rolling the costs of the replacement project into Transco's mainline system rates would be contrary to the Commission's Certificate Policy Statement.
