### **Transco's General Section 4 Rate Case Filing (Docket No. RP12-993-000)**

At the June 13th settlement conference, participants reached an agreement in principle that resolves all issues in the rate case. Therefore, on June 26th Transco filed, on behalf of the active participants in the proceeding, an unopposed motion with the Chief Judge and the Presiding Judge requesting that the current procedural schedule be suspended. In the motion, Transco stated that it intends to file a formal settlement agreement as soon as practicable; however, if a settlement agreement has not been filed by August 30th, Transco will file a status report with the Presiding Judge explaining the status of the agreement and the indicated date by which the settlement will be filed. On June 27th the Presiding Judge issued an order granting a suspension of the procedural schedule, but directs Transco to file a status report by July 30, 2013.

### **Leidy Southeast Expansion Project (Docket No. PF13-5-000)**

Transco has subscribed an additional 56,000 dth/d of firm transportation capacity under its proposed Leidy Southeast Expansion Project, increasing the size of the project from 469,000 dth/d to 525,000 dth/d. The Leidy Southeast Expansion Project will provide incremental firm transportation from points on the Leidy Line to Transco's existing Station 85 Zone 4 and 4A Pools in Choctaw County, Alabama.

### **Brandywine Creek Mainline "A" Replacement (Docket No. CP12-497-000)**

On June 25, 2013, Transco notified FERC that lacking the necessary FERC approval and given the timing restrictions imposed by Federal, State, and local authorities, this replacement project cannot be undertaken as planned during the summer and fall of 2013. Therefore, subject to the timely receipt of FERC authorization, Transco intends to perform the necessary pipeline replacement activities in 2014.

### **Virginia Southside Expansion Project (Docket No. CP13-30-000)**

On June 14, 2013, FERC issued its notice of availability of the Environmental Assessment (EA) for the proposed Virginia Southside Expansion Project. FERC Staff concludes in the EA that approval of the proposed project, with appropriate mitigation measures, will not constitute a major federal action significantly affecting the quality of human environment. Comments on the EA are due July 15, 2013.
